## RED DOT PISTOL FUNDAMENTALS & PERFORMANCE- 16 hours –taught by Hunter Freeland, Modern Samurai Instructor——————LIMIT TO 18 SLOTS

This is not an introductory level class. Students must have a solid pistol skill base to attend. Throughout the training, we will cover a wide range of important subjects, including zeroing your red dot, draw techniques, utilizing the necessary information for accurate shots, and optimizing red dot usage at different distances. You will learn the art of speed and efficiency in draw and presentation, explore dot tracking methods, and discover different modes of practice to enhance your skills.

We will also delve into target transitions and shooting on the move.. As part of the class, you will have the opportunity to put your skills to the test and potentially earn the esteemed Black Belt Patch.

**Equipment Requirements**: slide mounted red dot pistol, the ability to carry three magazines, a good-quality holster (NO SERPAS OR OLD LEATHER HOLSTERS), 1000 rounds of reliable ammunition, eye and ear protection, a Sharpie marker, and, most important an open mind ready to absorb valuable knowledge.

## TACTICAL EMERGENCY CASUALTY CARE FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT – taught by Craige Menefee———LIMITED TO 16 SLOTS—(NO LIVE FIRE)

Topics Covered: Hot Zone/Direct Threat Care that is rendered while under attack or in adverse conditions. Warm Zone/Indirect Threat Care that is rendered while the threat has been suppressed but may resurface at any point. Cold Zone/Evacuation Care that is rendered while the casualty is being evacuated from the incident site. Hemorrhage control including immediate action drills for tourniquet application throughout the course. Wound packing of injuries where a tourniquet cannot be applied. Treatment of airway emergencies, including the application of chest seals. Remote medical assessment. Techniques for dragging and carrying victims to safety. Scenario based training and sensory deprivation drills.

**Equipment Requirements:** Duty belt and pistol **NO LIVE AMMO**, Eye and ear protection, Gas masks if issued one, Plate carrier, Ballistic helmet, Note taking material, water, wet weather gear if raining, medical kit if issued one.

Prerequisite— This clinic will be tailored to Intermediate/Advanced level performance thresholds. Keeping this in mind, we would like to ask that participants meet a few prerequisites. \* Completion and Pass of 40hr. Basic L.E. Sniper course or higher. \* Currently deployable with your team as part of your official duties. \* Good physical condition. \* Be a student of the art.

- Tripod. Rifle rated. Be familiar with deployment and setup. \* Quality rifle sling suitable for positional shooting as well as "hands free" movement and carry. \* Quality folding bipod attached to the rifle. Support bags as used on duty if any. \* Wear clothes and gear that you would deploy with on live op. Prepare for variable weather. \* Ear protection. If you deploy with muff style, that is what you need to use.
  - \*Laser Range Finder. Either hand held or weapon mounted \* Anything and everything you need to clean or maintain your rifle on site.

#### **Required Equipment**

#### Operators / Runners—each member must have the following

- · Soft Body Armor / plate carrier with armor
- · Eye Protection / · Ear Protection
- · Pistol belt with a secured holster (no competition holsters or paddle holsters)
- · Duty-issued Handgun (No competition handguns) RED DOT SIGHTS ARE ALLOWED
- · Duty issued Patrol / Primary Rifle (AR type) with a sling. (No competition rifles) RED DOT OR LPVO ARE ALLOWED
- · BDU style uniform (Team T-shirts are acceptable)
- · Tactical Boots (No tennis shoes, Salmons / Merril types are allowed)
- · Gas Mask w/ filter
- · Handgun—Minimum 3 magazines 55 rounds ammunition per operator RED DOTS ARE ALLOWED
- · Rifle—3 magazines, 65 rounds ammo per operator—RED DOTS, IRONS and LPVO ARE ALLOWED

## **Sniper:**

- · All normal call out equipment, soft body armor / plate carrier with armor
- precision rifle (.308, 6.5 Creedmoor or .223) with 60 rounds of ammo NO ARMOR PIERCING ROUNDS
- · Duty issued handgun (no speed/competition weapons) and one magazine with 20 rounds ammo.
- · BDU style uniform
- · Tactical boots—NO TENNIS SHOES (Salmons / Merril types are allowed)
- · Any other equipment that the sniper wishes to carry THROUGHOUT the entire event.

<sup>\*\*</sup> One additional team member/department representative may accompany the competition team to take pictures and assist with equipment/inventory between events. This is a 2 day event and it is recommended that operators have an extra set of boots/clothing available following Day 1 events in the event of inclimate weather.\*\*



#### LTPOA AWARDS NOMINATION CRITERIA

Nominations must be submitted in writing to the LTPOA, 1104 Royce Drive, Alexandria, LA, 71303. They may be emailed to tcarnline@rpso.la.gov. The awards are for incidents occurring between May 1st of one year to April 30th of the previous year. Nominations for each award submitted to the LTPOA must comply with the following criteria:

- Nominees must have current individual membership of LTPOA for the individual award.
- Nominees for the Team Valor award must have current team membership.
- Nominations must include the nominee's name, organization and reasons for nomination or a brief narrative of the incident.

The narrative must include accurate information on jurisdiction, agencies and the dates on which the officer performed the actions making him / her deserving of the award.

#### Robbie Beane Individual Excellence Award

This award is presented each year to the person who contributes the most to further the goals of the tactical community. A selection committee bases its decision on an evaluation of his or her performance, dedication and leadership. This award was renamed in honor of Det. Robbie Beane, Beauregard Parish S.O. and Region 6 Representative, who was killed in a motor vehicle accident at our conference in Shreveport on May 5th, 2009.

The award recognizes the recipient for:

- Unselfish dedication to the enhancement of the tactical unit capabilities.
- Continuing efforts to increase tactical officer safety through training and mutual exchange of information.
- Epitomizing the highest standards of professionalism and honor in all aspects of law enforcement.

#### Carruth – Ezernack Team Valor Award

This award is presented each year to a SWAT/Tactical Unit whose members distinguish themselves through valorous actions during a tactical operation. This award is in honor of Officer Jay Carruth and Officer David Ezernack of the Alexandria, Louisiana Police Department SRT who were killed in the line of duty February 20<sup>th</sup>, 2003 while executing a search warrant to arrest a suspect in the attempted murder / ambush of a police officer just two days earlier.

The narrative must include accurate information on jurisdiction, agencies and the dates on which the officer performed the actions making him or her deserving of the award.

Awarded to a Tactical Unit whose members distinguished themselves through valorous actions during a tactical operation. A selection committee reviews a situation in which members of the nominated unit clearly act without regard for the safety of their own lives in order to neutralize a suspect, thus protecting fellow officers and/or innocent victims and bystanders.
